Our faculty members lead our students to the cutting edge of innovation and leadership in business.



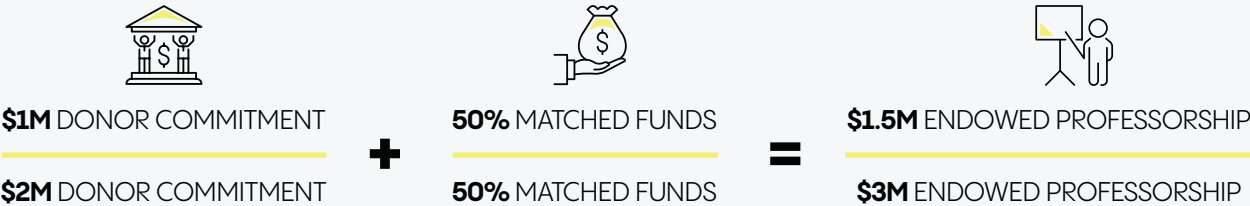

HOW IT WORKS

Professorship endowment gifts are matched at 50 percent. These funds help Goizueta attract and retain the highest-quality faculty members and enhance every aspect of the student experience. For tenured and tenure-track faculty members, \$1.5 million is the minimum to establish an endowed professorship; \$3 million is the minimum to establish a distinguished professorship. For non-tenured faculty members, \$1 million is the minimum to establish a professorship or administrative chair.

Tenured or tenure-track faculty



Non-tenured distinguished teaching fellows (for professors of the practice) **and/or administrative chairs for faculty serving in designated associate dean roles.**



To qualify for a match, gift commitments must be documented with a gift agreement and fully paid in five years or less.
